AAS degrees require 60-70 credits and consist of technical studies, general studies and electives. Complete your degree in as little as two years or attend part-time to fit your schedule. Some or all credits may be applied toward a bachelor's degree program at a four-year college.

Technical Diploma (TD) programs help you prepare for a targeted occupation, typically at the entry level. Credit requirements range from 3-70 credits, and many programs offer full & part-time options. Some credits may be applied to associate degree programs.

Apprenticeships (A) are an earn-while-you-learn program of on-the-job training combined with related classroom instruction for a skilled trade. Both the employer and the apprentice must be contracted with the Bureau of Apprenticeship Standards to begin the program.
