



Cost of Attendance 2024-2025

The estimated Cost of Attendance (COA) is a budget that includes categories of expenses that a student can expect to incur while attending college. The COA does not reflect actual charges. It is an average based on the estimated living costs typical of our region. Per federal regulations, a student's total financial assistance may not exceed their COA.

Expenses include tuition/fees, living expenses, books/supplies, transportation and personal expenses. Some programs do include additional material charges and/or licensure fees, which are not reflected below. The COA for students in those particular programs will be adjusted as needed.

Refer to the charts below to determine your estimated student expenses. Key items to note:

- **Three-quarter time & Half-time:** Tuition and book allowances will be reduced
- **Less-than-half time:** Tuition & book allowances will be reduced. No personal or room & board allowances are provided.
